Colossians 2:6,7 Therefore as you have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him, having been firmly rooted and now being built up in Him and established in your faith, just as you were instructed, and overflowing with gratitude.

Holding Each Other Up

Exodus 17:11 As long as Moses held up his hands, the Israelites were winning, but whenever he lowered his hands, the Amalekites were winning.

How long can you hold your hands above your head? It is difficult to do it for any length of time at all. Now suppose that you have something in your hands that add some weight. The extra weight makes it nearly impossible to keep our hands up. In Exodus 17, some Amalekites came and attacked Israel. Joshua and some soldiers were sent to battle them. Moses was to stand on top of a hill with the staff of God in his hands. When Moses held his hands up the Israelites were winning the battle. When his hands grew tired and he lowered them, then the Amalekites were winning. Lives could be lost if his hands were not help up. What a tremendous burden to bear.
