One of the wealthiest and saddest stories ever is the story of Howard Hughes. Hughes' life started out with great potential, but sadly ended in a pitiful condition. At one time he was the wealthiest man in the world but died as a spiritually bankrupt individual. The facts tell us he was born in 1906 in Houston, Texas. His mother, Allene, died when he was only fifteen. His father was a Harvard educated attorney and a great inventor. He invented the rotary drill bit and one-hundred-sixty-six cutting edges. He formed the Hughes Aircraft Corporation which at one time was a major aerospace and defense contractor. Howard Jr. later inherited 75% of the family business, making him an instant billionaire. With so much wealth and power in his hands, how could he go wrong? However, he died in 1976 in obscurity and isolation, coupled with extreme phobias and drug addiction.

Now for the "Rest Of The Story": Howard's great, great-grandfather was John Allen Gano. The dining hall at Freed Hardeman is named after this pioneer preacher. He was one of the restoration followers and friend of Barton Stone and Raccoon John Smith (two prominent pioneer and restoration preachers). Hughes' great-grandfather was also a gospel preacher. His son, W. E. Gano, (Hughes' grandfather) was also a lawyer and a faithful gospel preacher. This did not carry over to his parents. In the end it took only one generation to separate Hughes from the religious identity of the family. In 2 Timothy 1:5, the apostle Paul said of Timothy, "When I call to remembrance the genuine faith that is in you, which dwelt first In your grandmother, Lois, and your mother Eunice, and I am persuaded that it is in you also." His mother and grandmother took the time to share their faith with him and teach him God's word. Paul would later write how from childhood Timothy had known the Holy Scriptures (2 Tim. 3:15). By the time Paul met Timothy he already had a good reputation as a faithful and capable young man (Acts 16:1-2). Paul was able to take him along with him and train him further as a gospel preacher and missionary. God only knows how many lives he touched and how many souls were saved because of his work. It all was made possible because as a young child two faithful women took the time and opportunity to teach their son/grandson God's word. Far too often we are overly concerned with passing on material possessions for our children. Instead will you will you pass on your faith to your children?



Summits of the Psalms

80:7 Restore us, O God Almighty; make your face shine upon us, that we may be saved.

The writer of this Psalm finds himself in the same circumstances as the previous Psalm. He used a metaphor to convey his message. Israel was a vine that was owned by God. He brought them up out of Egypt and planted them in a new location. The land was cleared and the vine took root and filled the land. Israel was prosperous. In the course of time, things had changed. The wall of protection was broken down. Those who passed by helped themselves to her grapes. Wild boars from the forest ravaged it as well as other wild animals. And finally the author felt as if the vine had been cut down and thrown into the fire. God's vine which had flourished was in the process of dying out. The writer is dismayed by what he saw and cried out to God for restoration.

The Psalmist cried out for restoration. His desire was for Israel to be a prosperous vine once again. Sin had separated Israel from her God and three times in this short song he called out for restoration. O, to see God's face shining upon the nation once again. O, to be in a proper relationship with God. The second request was for revival. He wanted the nation that was on the verge of death to come alive again. Today, let's ask ourselves if we are in a proper relationship with God. If not, let's cry out for restoration and revival. Ask God to restore the joy of life and the joy of salvation. Ask God to revive our sickly souls into one that is full of life and zeal. Call upon his name and he will be listening.
